BACKGROUND



Combined Retirement System

- The Combined Retirement System, or CRS, started production in the late 1990s
- It was initially used as a retiree payroll processing system, issuing the monthly retirement checks
- Use as an employer subsidiary system and payroll processing program began in 2000 replacing a much older system

Combined Retirement System

Use by the Division

- CRS is a mainframe product
- Support for this system is slowly eroding
- System upgrades are difficult, time consuming, and modification is expensive
- Multiple iterations of programs used by employers to migrate data, like DataEntr and eReporting

Combined Retirement System

Use by Employers

- Much work is performed AFTER data is imported into CRS
- Payroll "errors" are not noted until payroll is matched up with CRS information
- System is still functional, but many years of improvements are available for data entry, compliance, and processing

WHY CHANGE?



Why Change?

- CRS is old and not supported by vendor
- Great advances in technology that are not being used
- Currently using multiple programs to do the work that are available in one system
- New system would be more efficient for the Retirement Systems and provide better products for the employers and members.

Why Change?

- This upgraded system will replace many manual processes performed by the Division
- The Division will have everything under an integrated system (replacing multiple systems the Division currently uses with duplicate data)
- Able to integrate the health benefits of the retirement plans, eliminating duplicate work

SYSTEM MODERNIZATION



- New vendor is Sagitec
- Sagitec is headquartered in Minnesota with offices in the USA, Canada, and other international areas
- They design and deliver tailor-made pension, and health and life software solutions to clients of all sizes



- Their product is called NEOSPIN, but DRB will rebrand with something "catchy and cool" ©
- Browser-based software system
- Benefit to members and employers with self-service capabilities
- Changes the way DRB interacts with employers and members

- Employer payroll reporting will change
- Payroll staff will be able to see and correct errors prior to submitting the files for processing
- More error checking capabilities ahead of time will eliminate back and forth with DRB
- DRB will update employers on key dates and impacts

Teacher Service End Dates

- Teacher Service End (TSE) letters sent to your payroll staff by email on April 30th with a reminder sent the week of May 18
- TSE and TERM events need to be entered to ensure that service is correct
- TSE dates are to be entered the day after the last day worked; TERM events need to be entered as of the last day worked
